THE JUNIOR AWARDS

There are four prizes in the Junior classes of the Exhibition.

These are awarded to the overall winners in each of the four age groups in the 18 and under sections.

In 2017, the four age groups were changed to become Under 6 years, 6 to 8 years, 9 to 11 years, and 12 to 18 years. Before 2017, the groups were differently split but the change was made to be fairer to the large cohort in the primary school years.
