One of the projects which we have been working on is the new pavilion for which we put in a planning application only to be told that we would have to re-site it, away from protected trees. The bus service continues to serve the village. However, after speaking to Mike who is the manager, it appears that it is not used as much as it could be. VILLAGE PLAN

The Parish Council voted in the September meeting to prioritise the development of an update to the 2009 Village Plan over the development of the Neighbourhood development plan in the September meeting. It was felt that the village would get more benefit in the short to medium term addressing issues that we can directly influence such as

- Traffic and parking issue recommended solutions
- Future plans for our community facilities (Village hall, new Pavilion, Old Stables, etc)
- Planned improvements to our infrastructure
- Vision for open spaces such as the Village Green and beautifying the high street

The Neighbourhood Plan activities that focussed on housing allocation and future development policies will be out on hold until after the Village Plan is completed. The goal will be to complete the Village Plan update by the end of 2018.

We have already had a number of consultations over the past two years that will feed into this work and the members of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee have expressed interest in contributing in to the Village Plan activities. Councillor Donahue will be leading this effort and setting up a working group and steering committee structure. Anyone interested in getting involved should contact Jim at jjmdonahue7@gmail.com. One area where we urgently need volunteers is to plan and prioritise improvements the existing Village Hall.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO TEACH DIGITAL SKILLS

Your county council has launched a new campaign appealing for digital helper volunteers to teach basic digital skills to people in their community.

What are digital helpers? Digital helpers teach basic digital skills to people with little or no experience of using computers or the internet. They volunteer in libraries, providing one-to-one support and encouragement to boost confidence and help people to help themselves.

Digital helpers teach skills such as how to set up an email account, search for jobs, complete online forms, navigate the internet and find useful websites, and use e-learning courses.

Why volunteer? Teaching digital skills has lots of benefits. It enables others to access employment and training, use online services, become more independent and less isolated.

But starting to do anything online when you don't know how can be daunting. That's where digital helpers come in!

Could you volunteer? If you are patient, have good communication skills, enjoy working with learners of all ages and can spare a few hours a week, we want you! Schedules can work around you so that you can fit it around your busy life.

WHITCHURCH BRIDGE – WIDENING OF THE PANGBOURNE APPROACH ROAD

We asked our engineering consultants Peter Brett Associates (PBA) to identify options for widening the Pangbourne approach road. They proposed various options and we later asked them to evaluate a further option – a “path through the trees” – suggested by a local resident. The PBA Reports are on our website. All the options are constrained by the trees, topography and other features of the local area.

After careful consideration we have decided on PBA’s option C2 as our preferred option. This would widen the narrowest part of the road from 4.7m to 5.2m – the same width as the road on the Bridge – and widen about 20m of the footway from 1m to 1.5m. The railings and kerbside rumble strip would be replaced, the roadway and footway resurfaced, the speed limit signage improved and automatic “20 mph – Slow Down” signage installed.

Option D – the “path through the trees” – initially looked attractive but we have had to rule it out for various reasons including cost, maintenance and access issues, planning risks, pedestrian personal safety and arboriculture concerns.

We have asked PBA to seek pre-application planning advice from West Berkshire Council and we will decide how to proceed when that work has been completed. We will continue to engage with our neighbouring landowners, Pangbourne Parish Council and Pangbourne Medical Practice, both of whom have kindly agreed in principle to site investigations and the proposed works on their property.
