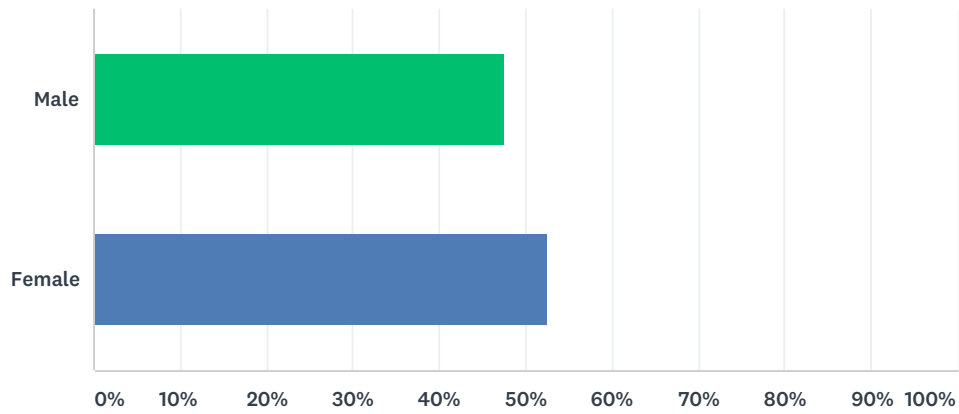

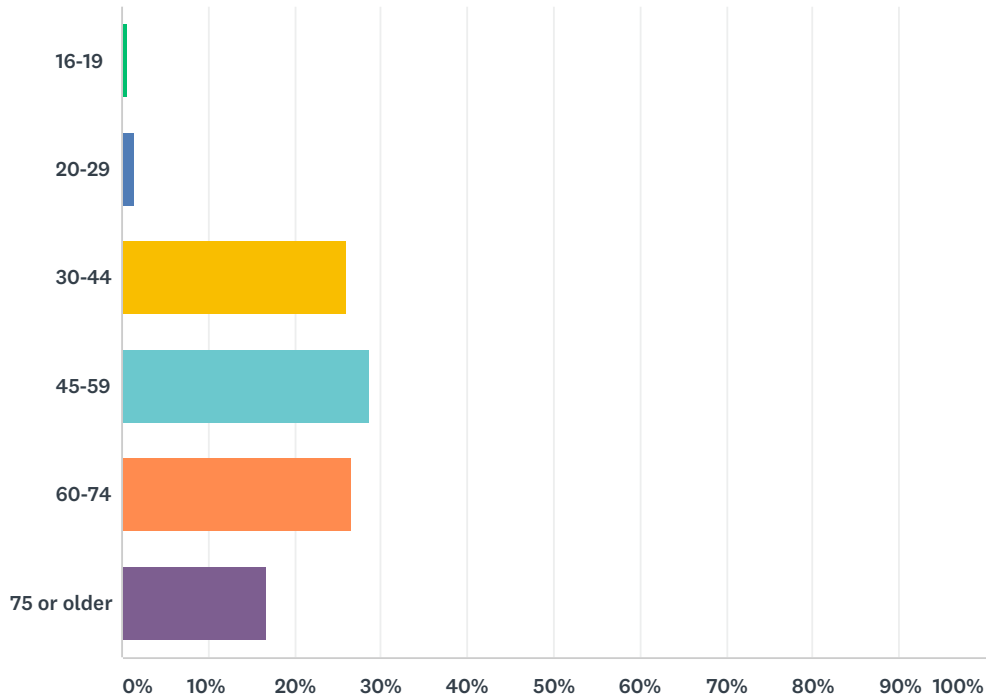

## Q2 How old are you?

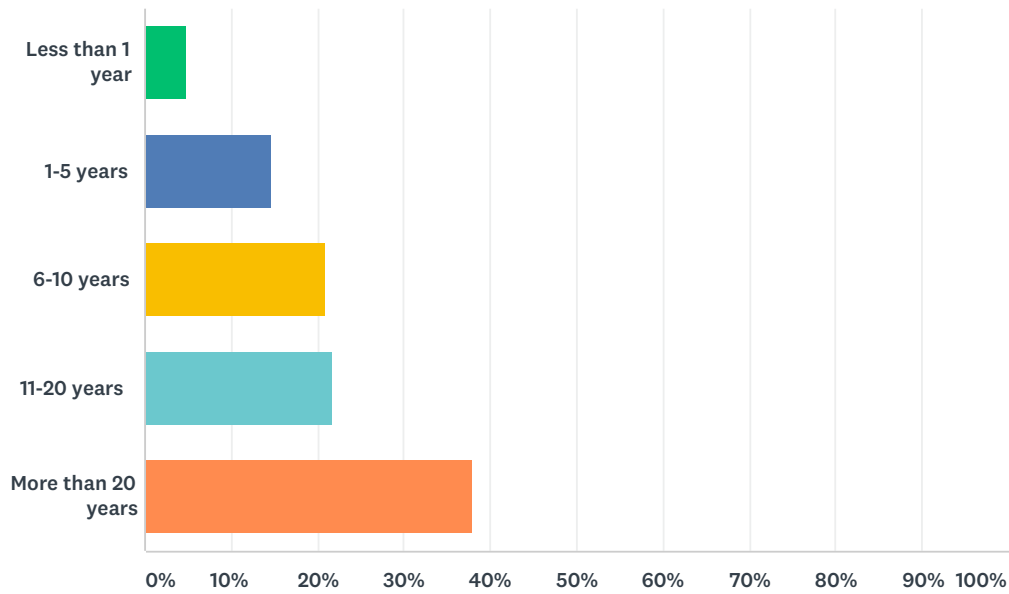

### Q3 How long have you lived in Whitchurch?

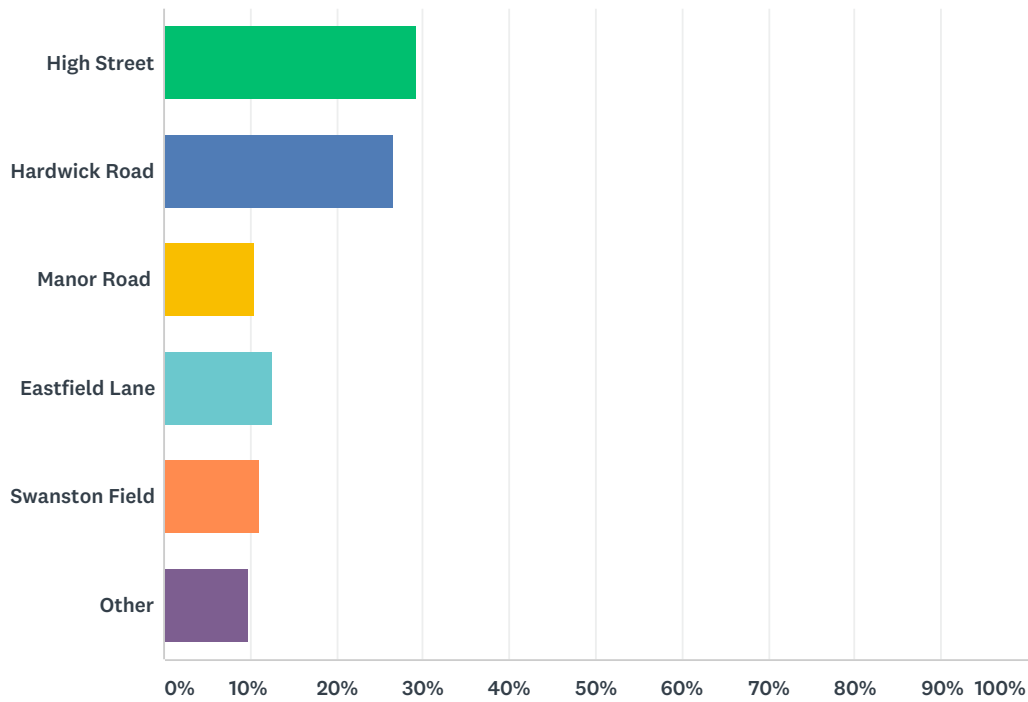

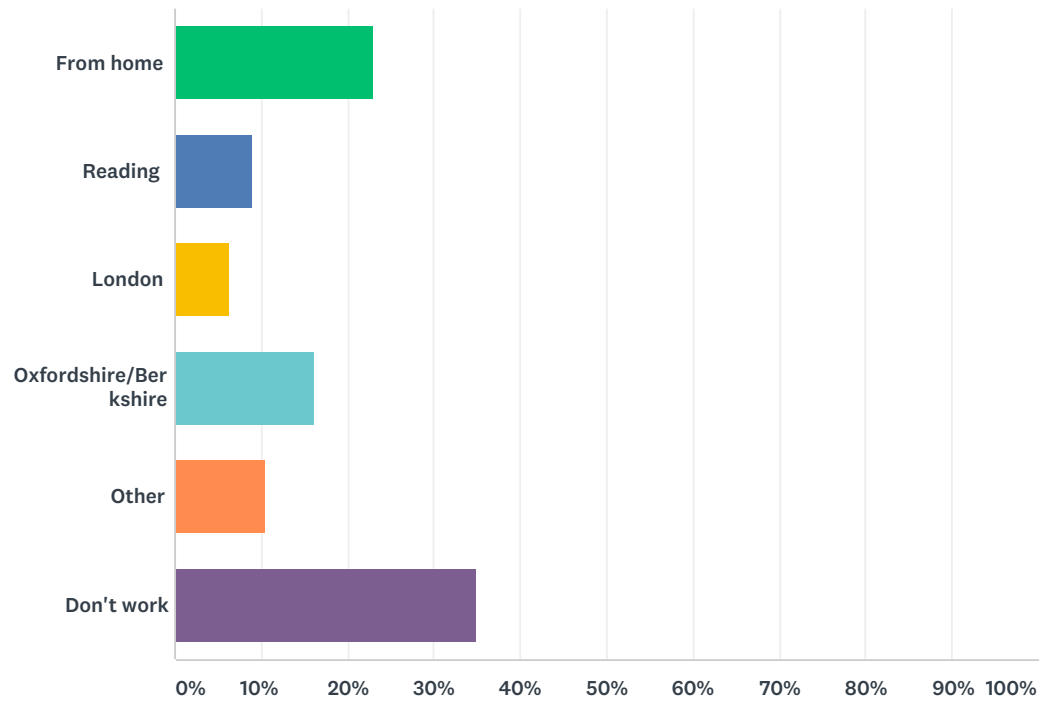

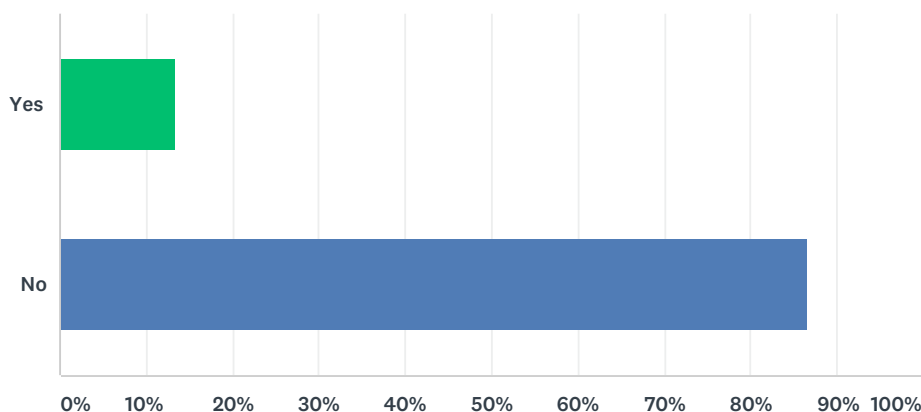

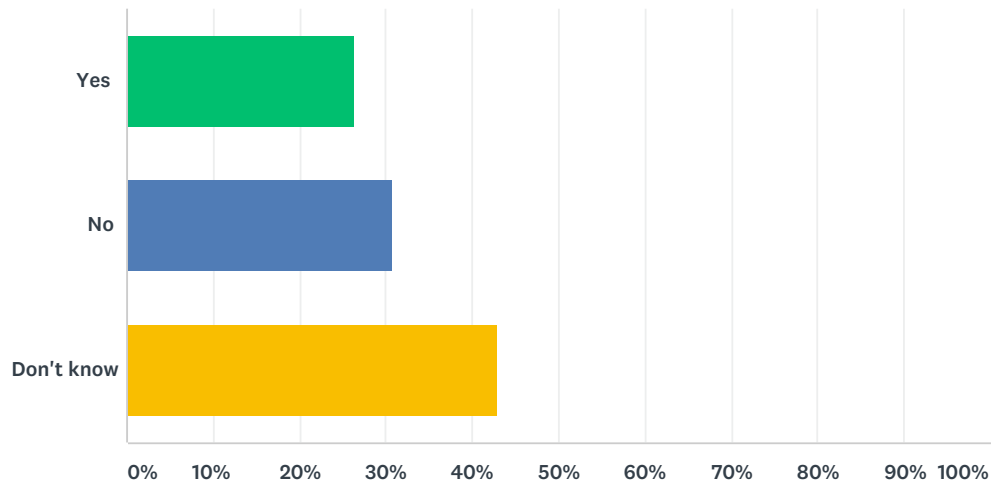

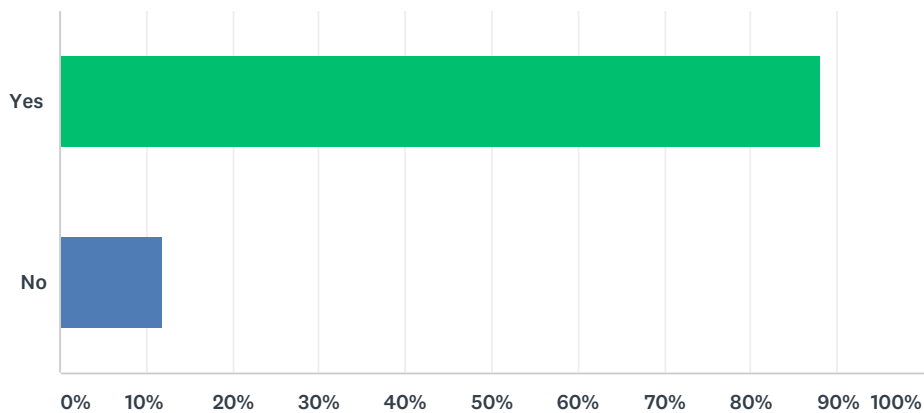

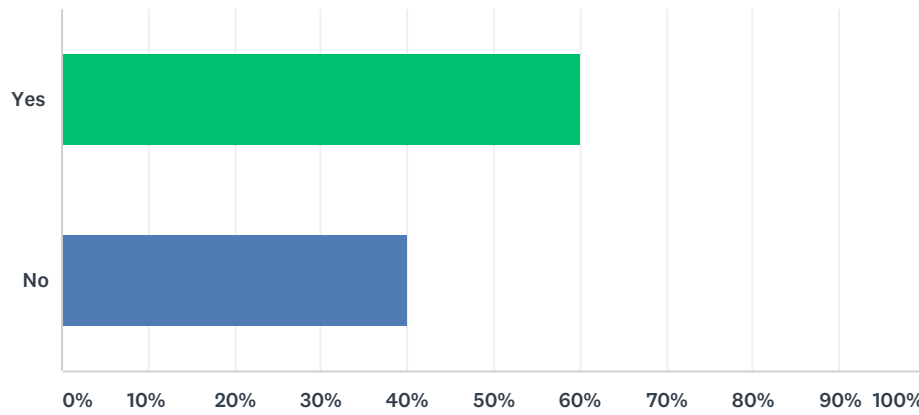

## Q21 Are you concerned about the risk of flash flooding due to poor drains management?

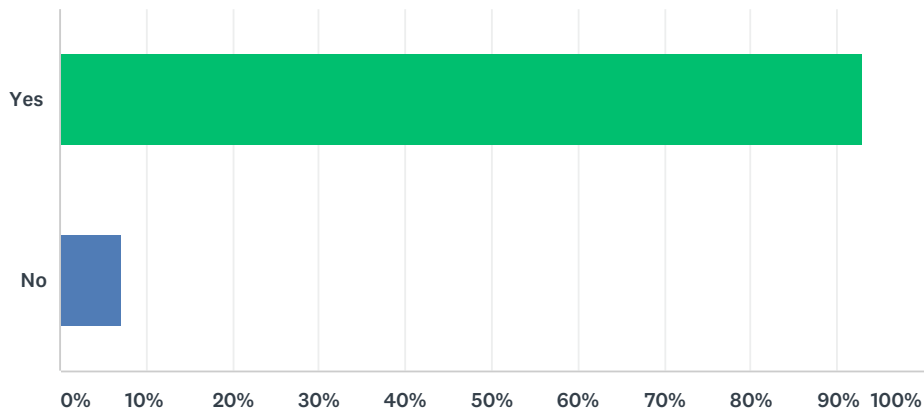

## Q22 Would you support a plan to reduce flood related risks (e.g. regular checking of drains, etc.)?

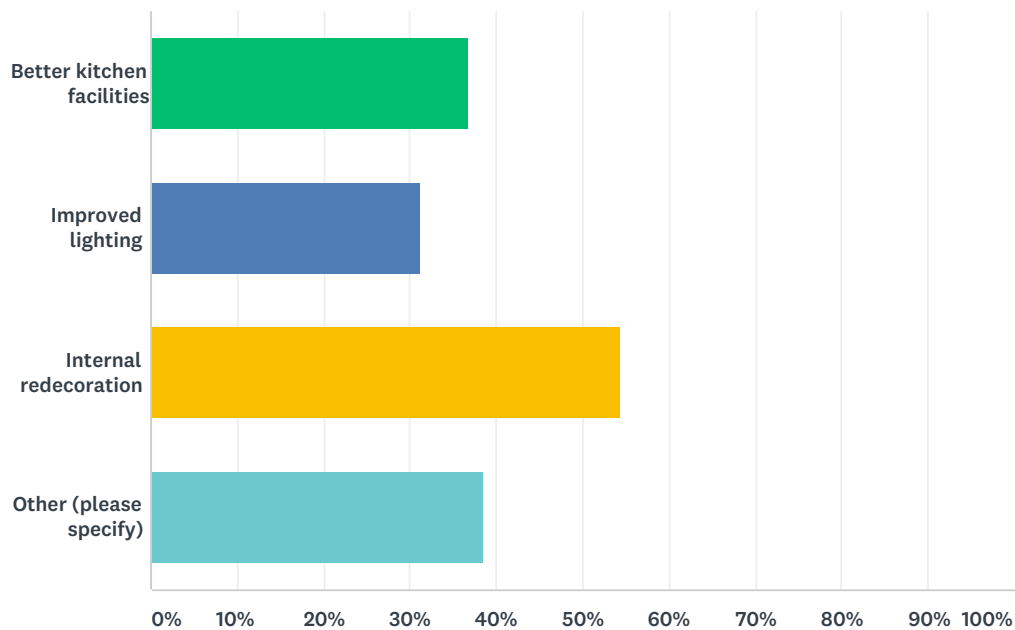

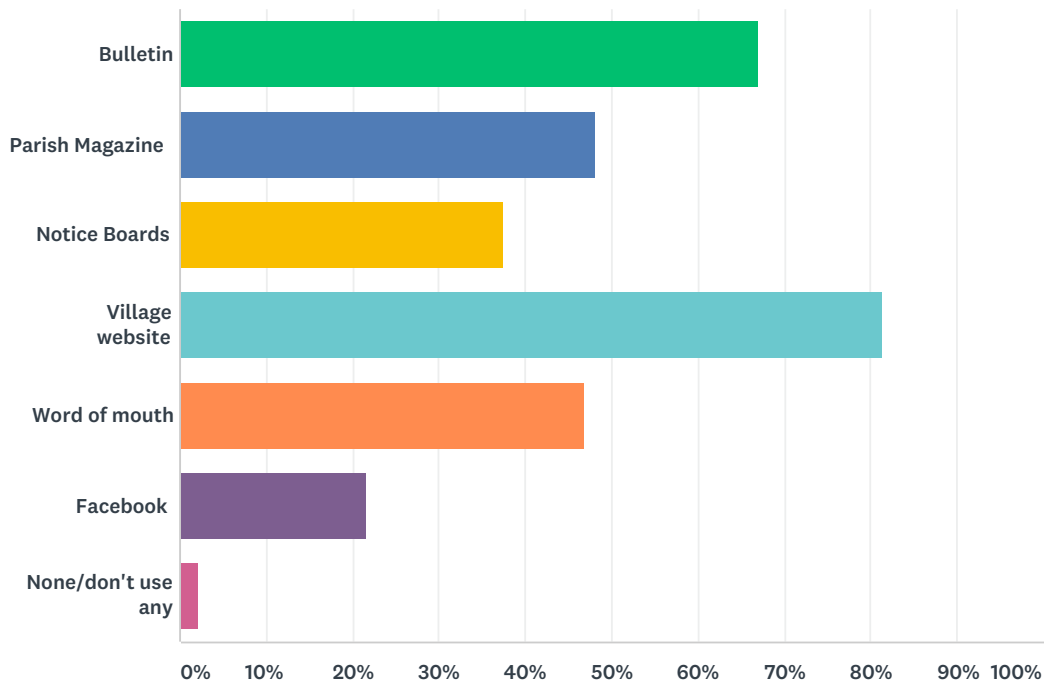

## Q28 What sources of information do you find the most useful? (Please tick all that apply.)

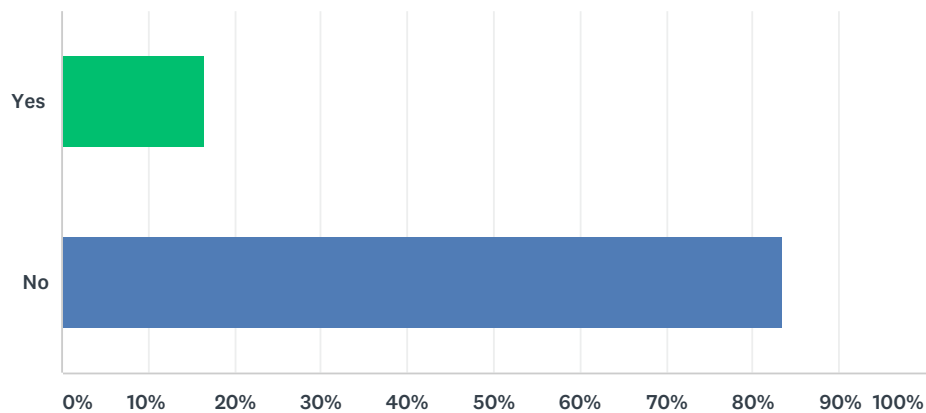

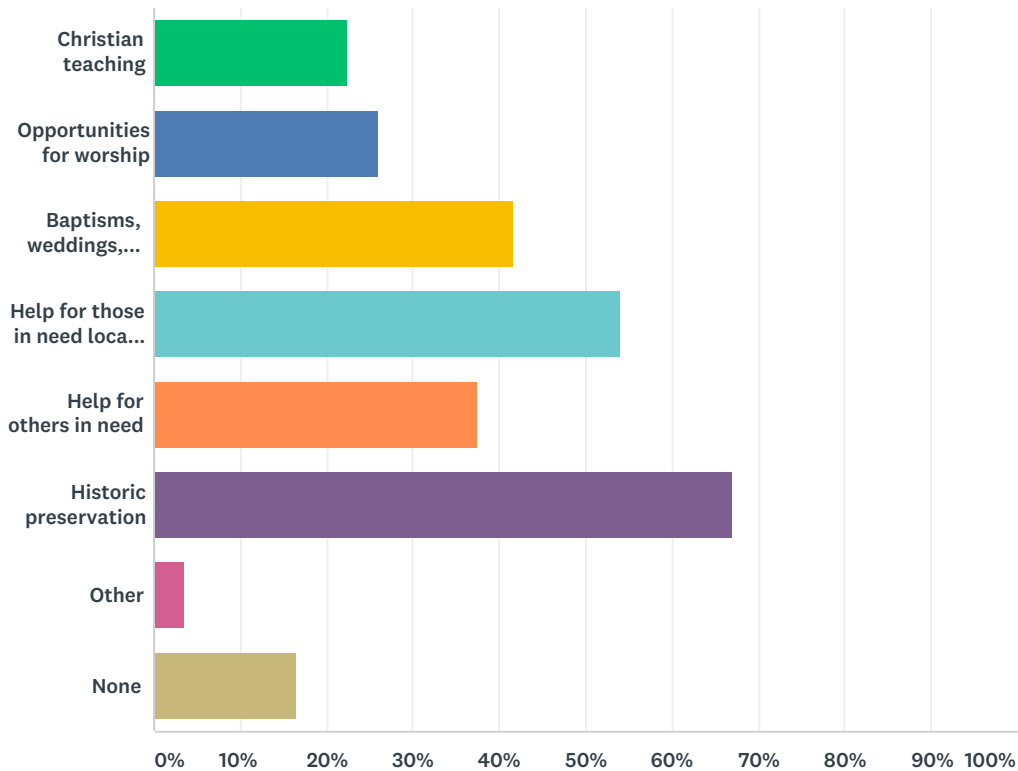

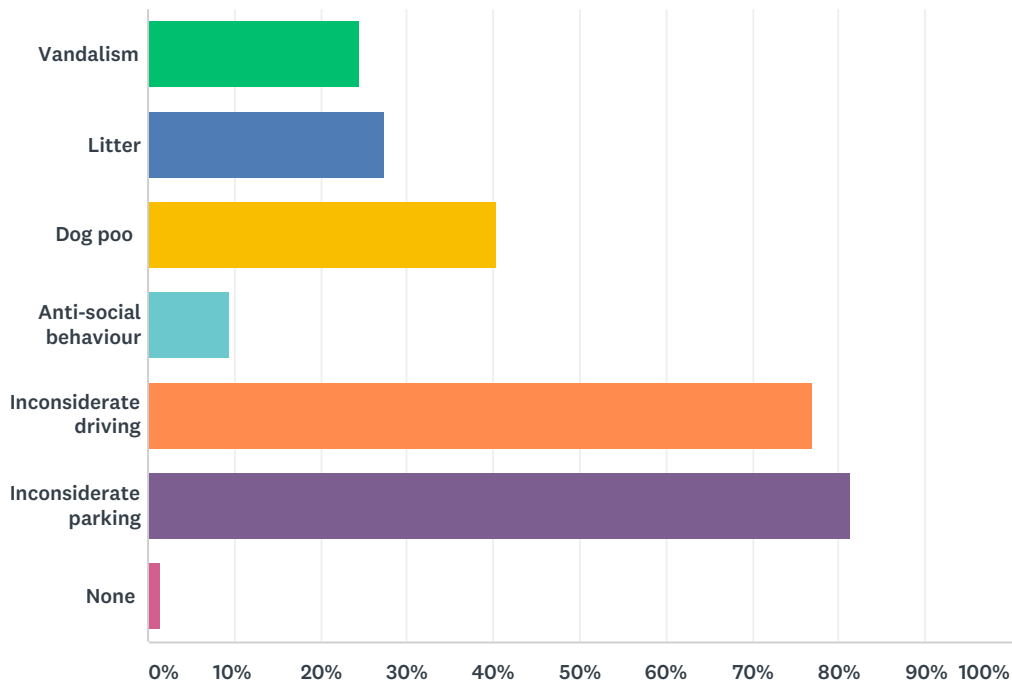

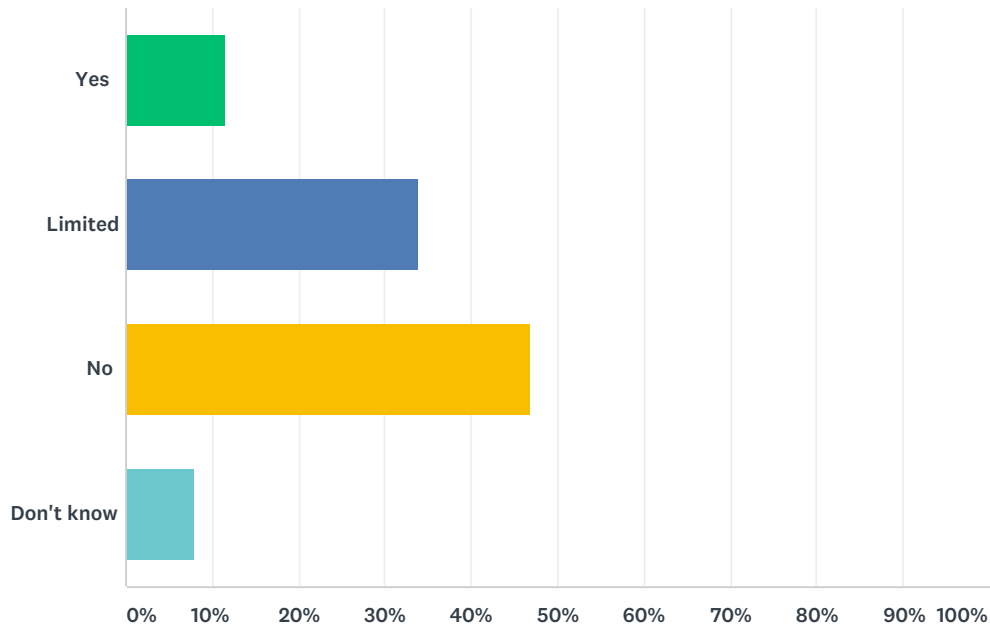

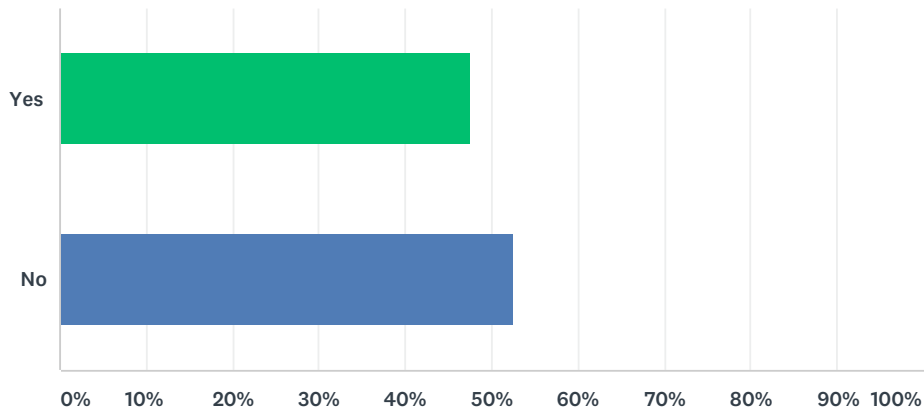

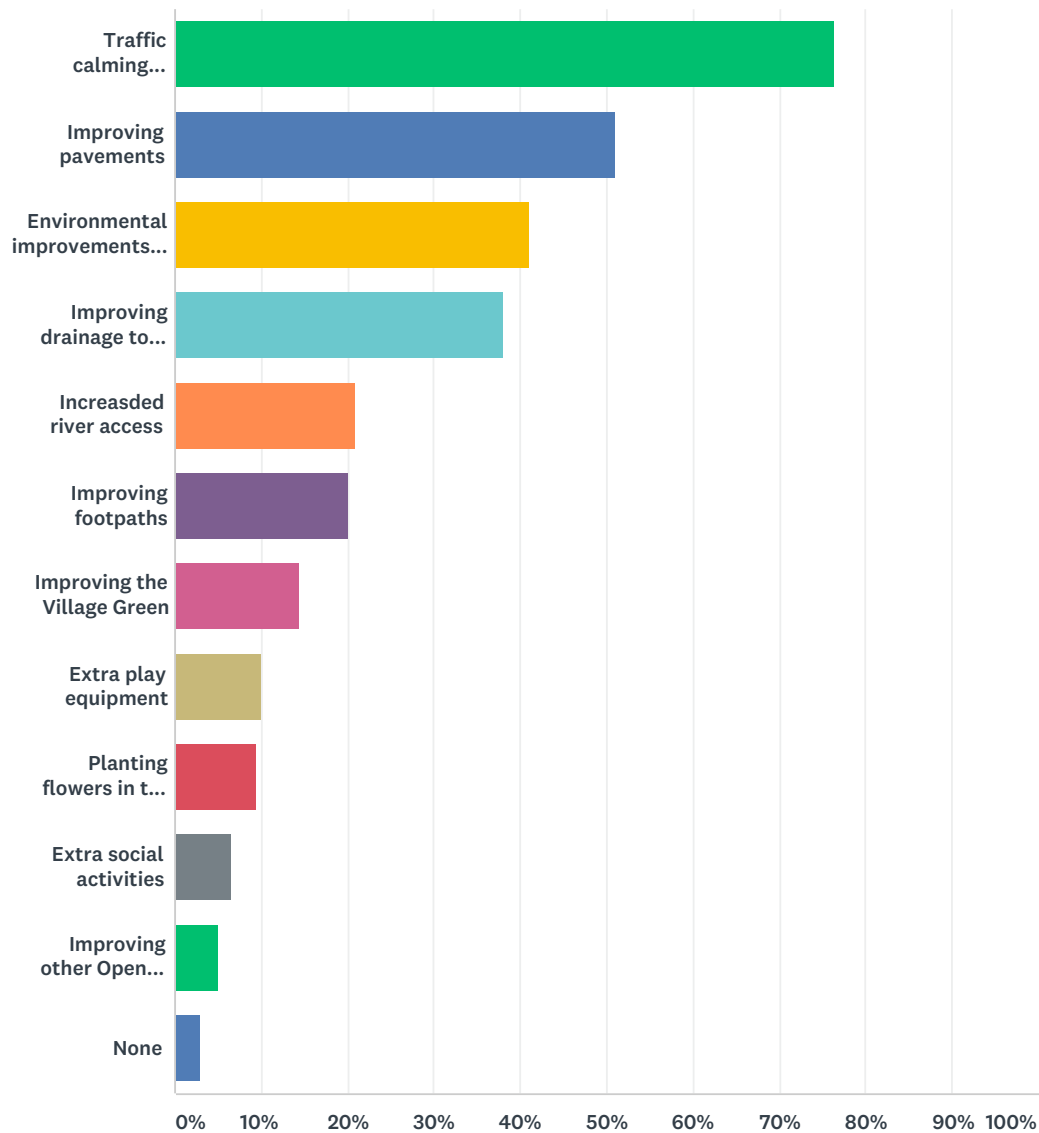

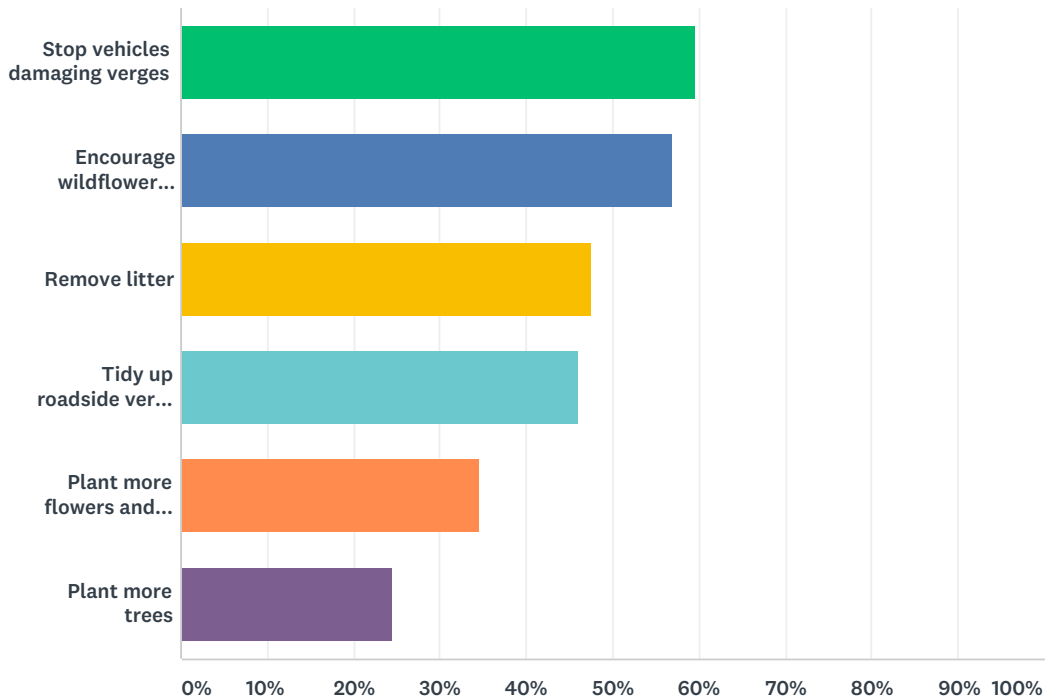

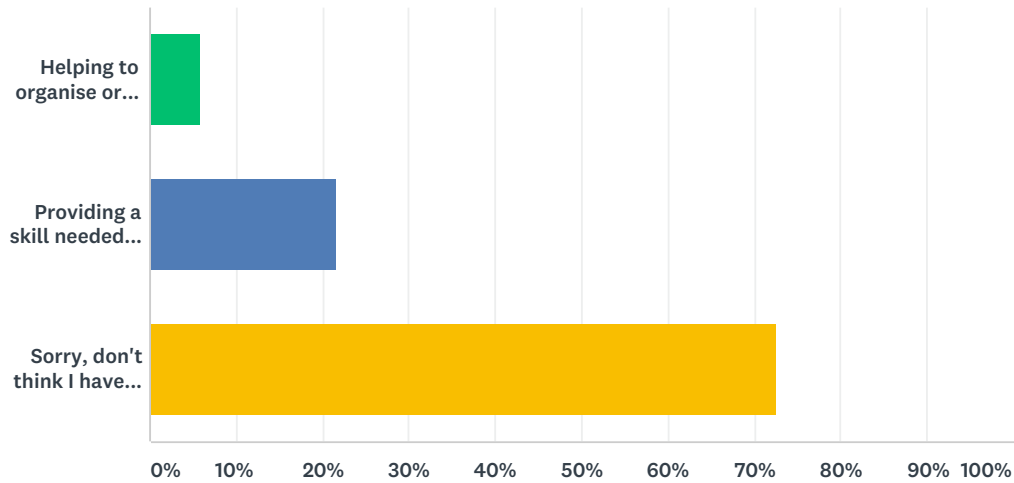
